

#### Through the kitchen door

A tasty light and refreshing afternoon treat

#### Lemon Drizzle cake

#### **Ingredients**

- •225 grms unsalted butter
- •225 grms caster sugar
- •4 eggs
- •finely grated zest of one large lemon
- •225 grms self raising flour

For the drizzle, juice of two lemons and 100grms of caster sugar

#### Method

- 1. Heat oven to 180C/fan 160C/gas 4. Beat together 225g softened unsalted butter and 225g caster sugar until pale and creamy, then add 4 eggs, one at a time, slowly mixing through. Sift in 225g flour, then add the finely grated zest of 1 lemon and mix until well combined. Line a loaf tin (8 x 21cm) with greaseproof paper, then spoon in the mixture and level the top with a spoon.
- 2. Bake for 45-50 mins until a thin skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean. While the cake is cooling in its tin, mix together the juice of 2 lemons and 100g caster sugar to make the drizzle. Prick the warm cake all over with a skewer or fork, then pour over the drizzle the juice will sink in and the sugar will form a lovely, crisp topping. Leave in the tin until completely cool, then remove and serve. Will keep in an airtight container for 3-4 days, or freeze for up to 1 month.

## Important NHS reminder for parents of four-year-olds

If you have a four-year-old starting school this autumn, are you sure all their vaccinations are up-to-date?

Hundreds of children in Kent and Medway miss out on the second jab to protect them against measles, mumps and rubella (MMR).

Now NHS Kent and Medway is reminding parents to check that children, especially those starting school this autumn, are fully vaccinated.

Dr Faiza Khan, Consultant in Public Health for NHS Kent and Medway, said: "Take-up rates for MMR immunisation in Kent and Medway are higher than the national average but we would like even more children to be protected.

"While between 93.1 and 95.6 per cent of children have their first MMR dose by the time they are two, the rate for the second MMR jab, given before the fifth birthday, is between 88.9 and 91.5 per cent.

"This is better than the England average of 86.9 per cent but still means around 1,200 children in Kent and 350 in Medway miss out on their second MMR vaccination each year.

"It may be that parents are busy and forget about this vaccination or that they do not realise how important it is.

"Both doses of the vaccination are needed to give children maximum protection against these serious diseases, and reduce the risk of outbreaks.

"Parents will be thinking about everything they need to do to make sure their four-year-olds are ready for that important first day at school. As part of that, we would urge them to ensure they have had all their vaccinations."

The first MMR immunisation is given within one month of the child's first birthday. The second dose should be given between the ages of three years and four months and five years, or before the child starts school.

Parents of children whose MMR vaccinations are not up-to-date should make an appointment at their GP surgery.

Even if your child has missed a vaccination, or is older than the recommended age, it is not too late to be immunised.

Uptake of MMR vaccinations in Kent and Medway from April 2011 to March 2012 - the most recent figures available

#### **NHS Medway**

2849 of 3203 children had their second MMR vaccination by their fifth birthday – meaning 354 missed out (an uptake rate of 88.9 per cent).

#### **NHS West Kent**

7474 of 7860 children had their second MMR vaccination by their fifth birthday meaning 386 missed out (an uptake rate of 91.5 per cent).

New youth choir in Gravesend We meet weekly for Rehearsals at Christ Church Tuesday evenings 6.30 pm to 7.30 pm The organisation 'Jews for Jesus' will be coming to Christ Church for 3 Wednesday evenings this Autumn, to relate 3 major Jewish festivals to our understanding of our Christian faith. Each evening will be visual and will start at 7.30 p.m. all are welcome – there is no charge, but 'Jews for Jesus' will have a collection plate at each session. All sessions are 'stand alone' - feel free to come to one or to all.

#### **Christ in the Passover**

#### Wednesday 12th September 2012. 7.30pm at Christ Church

Christ in the Passover shows the link between the ancient Festival of Redemption and Christ as the Lamb of God—your church members will never forget it!

This sermonic demonstration is visual, so the congregation will actually see a table set with traditional Passover items. The missionary uses Scripture as well as the visual items to walk through a Jewish Passover seder, weaving the story of the Exodus together with the life, death and resurrection of Christ. The words He spoke in the upper room come alive as each Hebraic item is carefully explained. Many churches finish this powerful presentation by celebrating communion, and most who have tell us that Christ in the Passover has deepened their church's communion experience.

#### Y'shua and the Harvest

#### Wednesday 24th October 2012. 7.30 p.m at Christ Church

The "Y'shua and the Harvest" message focuses on the link between Jesus, the Old Testament and the harvest. Our missionaries explain the purpose of the Jewish Autumn holidays or feasts from the Old Testament and the purpose of these celebrations both then and now. They then show how the coming of Jesus fulfilled these feasts and gave them a larger meaning. This is an excellent teaching on the relationship of the Old and New Testaments, Jesus and the harvest.

#### Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> December 2012. 7.30 p.m at Christ Church

"I am the light of the world; he who follows Me shall not walk in the darkness, but shall have the light of life." - John 8:12

Birthed out of the tumultuous Inter-Testamental Period, Hanukkah is a key celebration in the Jewish tradition. For many Christians, this near-Christmas, Jewish holiday carries a darkness of ignorance. Allow Jews for Jesus the opportunity to shed some light on the Festival of Lights. Discover the roots of Hanukkah, its current significance to the Jewish people, and what believers can learn from it today. More than a simple historical lesson, this message is also a call to purity and stresses the importance of letting "your light shine before men" (Matt:5:16
