We believe in the power of prayer to bring healing, comfort and the reassurance of God’s love into the day to day problems which we all face. Many people at Christ Church have found it helpful when going through sickness or difficulties of various kinds, to bring these to God in prayer. Sometimes it can also be helpful to know that others are praying alongside you.

There are a number of ways in which you can offer your own prayers or ask for the prayers of others, within the ministry at Christ Church. Some of them are listed here... please feel free to use any or all of these resources whenever you feel the need of God’s loving support and care. Rest assured that no problem is too difficult, and no problem is too

trivial... He cares for each of us and invites us to come to Him just as we are.

Daily prayers for the sick - those who are sick are prayed for at the Eucharist's that take place nearly every day. If you tell one of the clergy, they will be pleased to add a name to the list – please also remember to say when the person concerned has recovered!

Prayer requests – there are now slips of paper in red boxes, close to the candle stand and also at the back of the church. If you write your prayer request on the ‘tear off slip’ and put it in the box provided, then prayers will be offered at the Wednesday morning Eucharist.

Candle stand – you are welcome to light a candle and offer a prayer for a loved one at any time – the candle stand is in St Faith’s chapel.

Prayer tree – there is a prayer tree in the Warrior Chapel... this is another way to offer your prayers. Just write it on a label provided and hang it on the tree.

Whatever method you choose, we hope you will find the help and support you are looking for through God’s loving presence.





A very big thank you to everyone who supports the Foodbank, your generous donations week by week are very much appreciated.

Currently we are over stocked with cereals, tea, soup, beans, tinned tomatoes,

pasta and rice and short of many other items.

The following items are always in short supply - cartons of long life milk, sugar, cartons of fruit juice, squash, jars of pasta sauce, small jars of coffee, drinking chocolate, sponge puddings, rice pudding, tinned custard, instant mash, tinned meat and fish, spreads like peanut butter, marmite or jam, tinned fruit, toiletries and baby products (nappies and wipes but NOT baby food)

Reminder! Sue will be away for a bit

As many of you are aware, I will be away for 3 months this Spring. This is a time of refreshment, learning and renewal known as 'EMDL' – Extended Ministry Development Leave – which is available to clergy who have been in full-time ministry more than 10 years, and who are not close to retirement. My EMDL will begin after the services on Sunday 9th March, and I will be back in post on Friday 13th June.

During my EMDL I will be looking at 2 areas of my ministry... spirituality and leadership; as well as taking an opportunity to experience other churches and bring that experience back to share at Christ Church. Jeremy and I will be living (mostly) at a house we own in Rochester,

although you may sometimes see us in or around the Vicarage. For about a third of the time I will be away on various courses, and on retreat. The EMDL period will end with a study tour in the Holy Land. I will be keeping a journal of my reflections and look forward to sharing it with you all when I am back.

While I am away, the parish will be in the safe hands of Revs Jo Drew and Jacqueline Littlewood, the Churchwardens and the Ministry Team. There is an excellent team here at Christ Church and I know that everyone will rise to the challenge as they always do. If you need to talk to anyone about anything concerning the ministry at Christ Church while I am away, then please contact Jo or Jacqueline. Emails sent to me will be forwarded to Jo, and it will not be possible to leave messages on the Vicarage phone. I am very grateful to the PCC for agreeing so willingly to this opportunity, and to everyone who will be taking on additional roles during this time. I very much look forward to seeing you all again in the Summer.

CHARITABLE GIVING 2013

In 2013, due to your generosity and the hard work of many, we have been able to make many charitable donations.

INCOME

Lent Envelopes	£2,570
Good causes box, table sales and other donations	£1,690
Food Bank	£570
Christian Aid—2 breakfasts, coffee morning and Quiz evening	£676.30
Christingle for the Children's Society	£337

EXPENDITURE

£850 each of our four main charities—Crisis, WaterAid, Mission Aviation Fellowship and Word on the Street.

£55 each to Whitehill Primary School, Holy Trinity CE Primary School, House of Mercy, Gravesend Street Pastors, Larchwood Grove and Sherringham House.

We also sent a donation of £70 to Zulem Trust for Palm Crosses.

We paid £250 towards the education of Aly, our little boy in the Holy Land.

We sent £200 to help the people in Syria and £700 (£260 from good causes and £440 from the congregation) following the disaster in the Philippines.

We had a very successful Summer Dinner and £589 was given to Ifield School, this was 50% of the money raised.

50% of collections taken at weddings has also been sent to charities nominated by the brides. These amounted to £660



On the first Bank Holiday Monday in May, Kent cyclists will be pumping up their tyres to enjoy the sixth Cloisters Charity Bike Ride, starting and finishing as usual at Stansted Village Hall, Kent, TN15 7PH on Monday 5th May

Last year 335 riders took part, raising funds for the Friends of St Mary's Stansted and had a wonderful day riding through the quiet leafy lanes and charming villages of the North Downs of West Kent. The three rides provide something for everyone, from families to the serious cyclist, with interesting routes, excellent back-up, a ploughman's lunch, the promise of tea with scrumptious homemade cakes.

- **44 miles – “The Challenge”**: A lovely ride on many unknown lanes. A very good workout for the most hardened cyclist, a real challenge for the less experienced.
- **23 miles – “The Classic”**: A great ride that includes a very short 1 in 4 hill, with badges awarded to those who ride it! Suitable for all, but requires some training if you don't normally ride a bike
- **13 miles – “The Cruise”**: Quiet lanes especially suitable for the occasional cyclist and for families with younger children.
