

11th February 2009

Hi everyone! It's that time again and our naughty little sheep wants to be sure that you are all up to date with what we've been up to in the last few

weeks. On the 21st January our Pre-school children came into Church to sing their special songs and say their "Thank you" prayers. It was the first time that they'd been in Church since before Christmas and our naughty little sheep had really missed them. He told me that he was beginning to wonder if he was ever going to see them again. So he was relieved when they all streamed in. He'd also been a bit concerned because Betty Martin hadn't given him a cuddle lately but he needn't have worried because she came up trumps and in our chilly winter Church he was soon toasty and warm, and very happy. AND the children sang their Marching Song, so he joined in with gusto, doing all the actions too. It made an excellent start to his day! Our naughty little sheep also stayed in Church for the 10am service sitting very quietly next to me. He said that he had been a bit curious to see what actually goes on so he was pleased that I'd let him stay.

11th February is a lovely sunshiny, cold morning and the children from the Pre-school are in Church once again. They should have been in last week but Marian wasn't able to get in to play the piano because the weather was so cold and some of the roads and pavements were very icy. Our naughty little sheep told me that he thought that it must be great fun playing in the snow and he wished that he could build a snow sheep. Perhaps I'll take him out in the snow the next time we have some. Anyway it's lovely to see the children again. Sue our vicar can't be with us today because she's busy elsewhere, which is a shame. Our naughty little sheep is a bit puzzled because Floyd and Ethan have come in with blue hands and arms. He asks me if it's because they are really cold as it is a chilly day and I have to explain that they've been playing with blue coloured cornflour. He asks me if he can go back into the Preschool with the children and have a go for himself, because it looks like fun but I don't think that it's a very good idea. Blue cornflour and wool aren't an ideal combination!

Of course the children are very good and sing beautifully and when we say "Thank you" to God for the sun, Calum suggests that we say "Thank you" to God for the moon too, which of course we do. Our naughty little sheep asks if we can sing the song about butterflies, so we all sing "Creepy crawly caterpillar" and he's word perfect. He's getting far too clever! He'll be singing in the choir before we know where we are! Then it's time for Libby to blow out our candle and the children to go back into Pre-school. It's half term next week so hopefully we'll see them again when they return.

In a flash the afternoon is here and Julie and I are back in Church to prepare for First Steps. Joan Bennett, who is standing in for Marian, arrives to play the piano for us. The doors are opened and Daniel is first to arrive, with Nanny Barbara. Sadly his auntie Lisa and cousin Olivia can't be with us today.

They wanted to come but Barbara couldn't get the baby seat into her car. It was all too technical! I know the feeling! Next Kay arrives with Martha fast asleep in her buggy, again. Bless her she looks so peaceful! How long for, I wonder? Soon some of our other regulars begin to arrive as well as newcomers Mandy and daughters Madeleine and Amelie. It is so lovely to see them all. Julie has bought some new jingle bells and clackers, so we are going to have some lovely noisy fun.

Martha is already awake as we begin by singing "Candletime" and she is soon dancing in the aisle. I tell our little gathering that our theme today is Jesus' Parable of the Lost Sheep. And then we realise that someone significant is missing. Oh what a surprise! He was only with me a few minutes ago! Where on earth has he got to now? The children are all very keen to help me find him and we look high up on the window ledges and low down underneath the chairs and then suddenly Erin spots him. You'll never guess where he's perched. Honestly my heart did a somersault! He is precariously balanced on the font cover! How he got there I have no idea! Matthew very kindly helps me get him down. Our naughty little sheep tells me that in the Parable of the Lost Sheep, the shepherd finds the lost sheep in a very precarious position and he was sure that we would find him, too, before he fell down and had a nasty accident! Thank goodness he was right!

Back to our service and Erin is looking after our naughty little sheep now. It's a good job someone is! And with all the excitement I've forgotten our special candles so that is next on the agenda. Eager children cluster around our little altar to have candles lit for special people: a great grandma's 90th Birthday, a mum's 30th Birthday, and a dad's 40th Birthday; so there are lots of big 0 birthdays coming up very soon. There are lots of happy wishes too, for happy days!

When everyone is back in their seats I continue with our story, telling of the great lengths to which the shepherd goes, to find his precious lost sheep. And he is so happy when he finally finds it that he calls on all his friends and neighbours, inviting them round for a party to celebrate. We know that God loves us just like that, going to great lengths to bring us back to Him when we have lost our way, and rejoicing that He has found us. So we celebrate too, because we have found our little lost sheep, singing some of our favourite songs like "Here come the frogs" "Springtime comes" And "Mother Hen." We also sing "Baa baa black sheep" which pleases you-know-who! When we've said our special prayers and carefully blown out the candles, it is time to go out into the Hall for play, refreshments and chat. Joyce and Julie are busy in the kitchen and soon it's drinks and biscuits all round and now it's Tilly's turn to look after our naughty little sheep, much to his delight.

And before we know where we are, cups are washed, toys put away and it's time to go home. The children been given their colouring pictures to take home; a reminder of the Parable of The Lost Sheep and God's undying, self-giving love for each one of us. Our naughty little sheep and I hope that they will all be able to join us again on the 11th March when we will be thinking about Jesus' friends, his Disciples. Who knows what that sheep will be getting up to in the meantime! I certainly don't! God Bless. Rosemary Austin

Spring is just around the corner, and we are busy rehearsing for





Christ Church has very successful Brownie and Guide units within them. There isn't however a Rainbow unit which is a great shame because the younger girls miss out.

As Rainbows have recently celebrated their

twenty first birthday it surprises me that there are many people who don't know what Rainbows are.

They are the youngest section of Girlguiding starting at five and going onto Brownies at seven. As far as I am aware there has never been a Rainbow unit in Christ Church and I know that their commissioner would love to get one started. Rainbows don't do things rigidly and spend a lot of their time making craft things and playing games within their weekly meeting. They can work on badges but unlike Brownies and Guides they only work on them as a group and if a girl misses doing one thing she still gets her badge. They can, if they wish, go on overnights and I know of one unit that has been on four over the last few years. The girls really enjoy it.

If you feel you would like to find out more about what is involved in running a Rainbow unit and would like to consider starting one please give me a ring. There will be no pressure on you and no obligation but under Girlguiding rules you must be between the ages of 18 and 65.

One of the most popular annual events which takes place each May is the Kay's Garden Walk. This is a ten mile sponsored circular walk across beautiful countryside from Meopham and back again. The walk is open to not only Guiding groups but any other group or individual who may like to participate. Individuals will be placed within a group. Half the money raised goes towards the maintenance of Kay's Garden and the other half to the group you walk with. There are marshals placed at regular intervals around the walk and Saint Johns Ambulance are in attendance. The only stipulation is that you must have sponsors.

To all "Shoeboxers",

I have received a letter of thanks from Blythswood Care reporting on the Shoe Box appeal 2008.

Good News: 124,000 gifts were sent to children in Albania, Bulgaria, Hungary, India, Moldova, Romania, Serbia, Sri Lanka and Ukraine. The boxes from our region went to Hungary, Romania and Serbia. Blythswood Care's millionth box went to 7 year old Maria living in a gipsy village. Her whole family's income is less than £50 a month for six people.

Bad News: The number of boxes over the whole of Blythswood Care was considerably down, so if we are to continue to support this project in 2009 we will need to be prepared to do as much as we can. In this time of recession and limited finances I intend to buy suitable items during the year and keep

them until required. This also applies to shoeboxes!

This is the last paragraph from the letter: "Words cannot fully express how much we appreciate all the different ways in which you contribute towards making this appeal a success this year. I would just like to you all to know that in whatever way you have involved yourself in the Shoebox

Appeal, it is very much appreciated and will have made an impact upon the lives of people like Maria and her family in ways that we may never fully be able to comprehend."

#### GARDENING TIPS FOR MARCH







March, the beginning of the growing season for most of the plants grown in our gardens. Seeds can be bought and even sown indoors. Unless you know better by experience, follow the instructions on the suppliers packets.

With the longer daylight, milder weather and hopefully drier conditions it will be possible to get out into the garden and make all spic and span. The grass will start to grow at any temperature above 10 degrees Centigrade and will probably require topping by the end of the month.

A word of caution, summer bedding will probably be on display by the end of the month and be purchased.

Do not be too keen to buy! Summer bedding can be purchased and planted as late as the  $1^{st}$  of June. With the warm conditions prevailing in the middle of May these plants will thrive.

Any annual planted between Easter and Whitsun will catch up with any planted earlier, with no worry about loss through inclement weather.


