Floatplane landing at Rochester Cathedral this August



How do you fit a plane in a medieval Cathedral? That's the challenge Rochester Bridge Trust took on when they proposed displaying a recently restored Short Scion Floatplane inside Rochester Cathedral.

The plane has been rebuilt by Medway Aircraft Preservation Society Limited (MAPSL). Originally, the aircraft was built in the Short

Brothers factory that was once located on Rochester Esplanade, a short walk from the Cathedral.

An accompanying exhibition, **Pioneers of Flight: Made in Medway** will run alongside a range of activities taking place throughout August.
